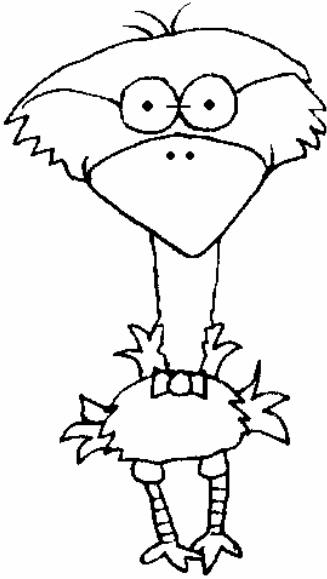

Adverbs are words used generally to modify (tell you more about) a verb, but can tell you more about any word other than a noun or pronoun.

Example: The bird flew quickly.
The word 'quickly' is an adverb.
