- *Full stops*

Full stops are used to mark the end of a sentence. You don't use a full stop when a question mark or an exclamation mark has been used.

- *A sentence*

A 'sentence' is a group of words that make complete sense on their own. A sentence usually has a noun and a verb, sometimes sentences might only have one word in it.

- *A noun* is a person, place, thing or idea.
- *A verb* is an action word.

If a sentence ends in a question mark (?) or an exclamation mark (!) you don't need a full stop. When you have used a full stop to end a sentence don't forget to start the new sentence with a capital letter. Full stops are used to break up sentences so we can have short rests when we read. They also help to make it more understandable. Can you imagine reading a book without any full stops?

Your Task:

Write a short story of exactly 12 sentences about fishing. Do not put any full stops, capital letters, question marks or exclamation marks in it.

Give your story to another student who is to put all the full stops, capital letters, question marks and exclamation marks in it.
